Season's Greetings!

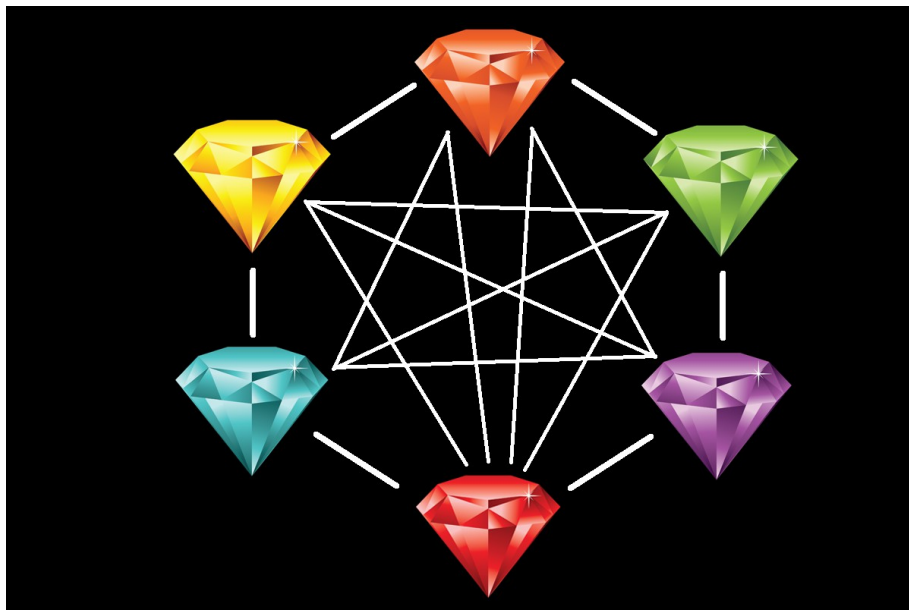
This is the exclusive May newsletter about my children's book, "Aurora and the Whispering Jewels: A South Pole Christmas Story."

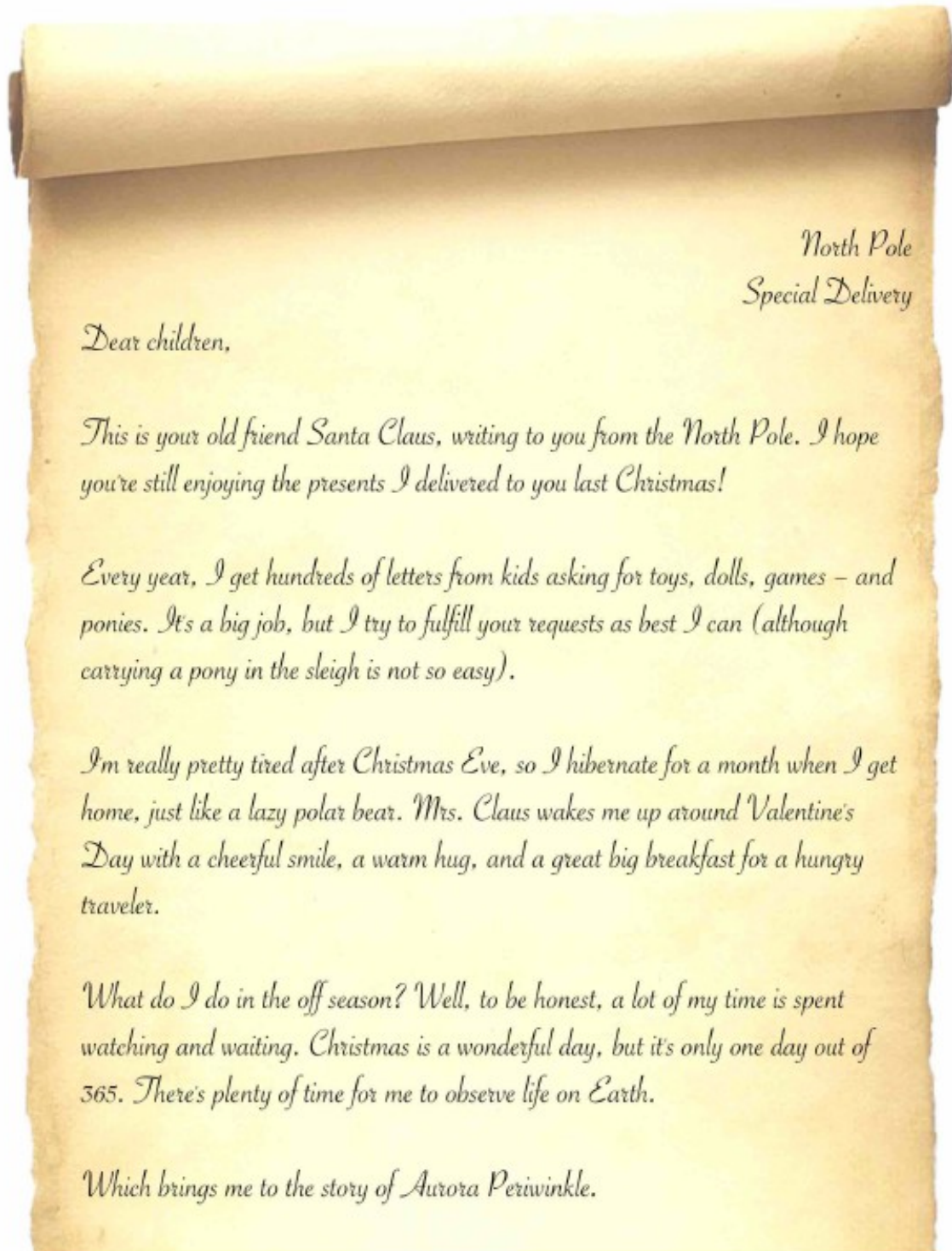
