If you have kids in your life, they might enjoy “Aurora and the Whispering Jewels: A South Pole Christmas Story” especially during the holidays.

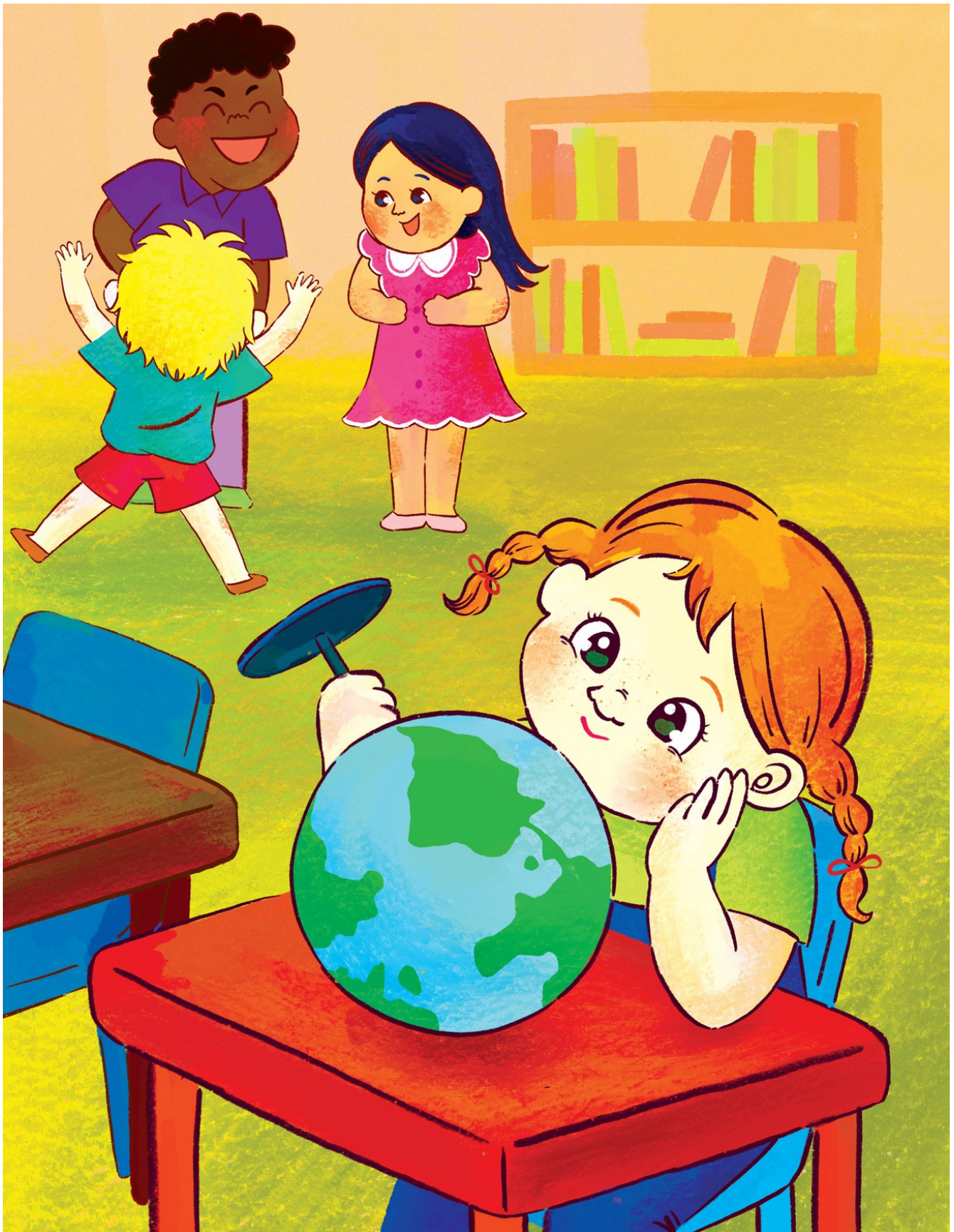
*“Imagine someone like Santa... at the South Pole.”*
